

Rules for Online Solving Tournament from town Ede, Netherlands.

Date: Saturday 8 May 2021 starting time 10:00 (CEST-time Amsterdam); in London 09:00; in Vilnius, Athens 11.00. Solving time for A Category is 2 hours and solving time for B Category is 3 hours.

12 Chessproblems to solve for all solvers. Maximum to score 115 points.
The first 5 chessproblems would be possible to solve for every solver.
The last 7 chessproblems are difficult.

Registration

The solver must be registered before the tournament starts. He informs organiser Alfred Gaasbeek. Closing date of registration is Friday 7 May 2021 at 20.00 CET.
